## **DEOMI Recon Team Responds in Wake of Hurricane Ian**

**PATRICK SPACE FORCE BASE, Fla.**—The Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute sent a recon team on Friday to assess the institute for possible damages caused by Hurricane Ian.Ian, a nearCategory 5 hurricane at landfall, wasdowngraded to a tropical storm by the time it arrived on Patrick SFB.

Ian passed over the base early morning Thursday with surface winds more than 50 knots (58 mph). The base was placed on HURCON 1 status, which restricted access to only those who have been authorized or are assigned to a hurricane recovery team, to minimize the hazards associated with Ian. In addition to high winds, these hazards included storm surges, heavy rain, flooding, and tornadoes or waterspouts—all of which residents in the area experienced.

Robinson said a thorough walkthrough of the facilitywas conducted and nosafety or health hazards were identified. She added that each floor of DEOMIwas dry,utilities were in normal working order, and DEOMI's network was fully operational.

This is good news for the institute because more than 50 in-resident students are scheduled to start phase two of the Equal Opportunity Advisor Course 23-1, on Monday. The EOAC is DEOMI's flagship course. The recon team's positive report, coupled with an "all-clear" from the Space Launch Delta 45 Commander, means that DEOMI retained its mission-ready status, despite having endured Ian's wrath.

Since its inception in 1971, then known as the Defense Race Relations Institute, DEOMI has developed and delivered innovative education, training, research, and collaborative solutions to approximately 52,000 DEOMI military and civilian graduates.
