U.S. Army Sgt. 1st Class Tony Cohen, human resources noncommissioned officer in charge of Personnel & Student Services at the Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute, promoted to the rank of Master Sgt. during a ceremony held January 17, 2023.

Cohen's promotion comes at the end of a sixyear pursuit for the highly sought-after rank. Master Sergeant continues to be one of the toughest ranks for Soldiers like Cohen, in service support career fields, to achieve throughout the Army. Nevertheless, Cohen did not let this discourage him.

Cohen, a native of Brunswick, Georgia, began his Army career as an active-duty Soldier in November 2003. He has held multiple human resources positions throughout the Department of Defense, both stateside and overseas, during his 20-year career.

"Thank you for always being there," Cohen said to his wife.


Cohen then said there have been several current and former leaders who helped him get to where he is today, and he took his promotion ceremony as an opportunity to show his appreciation.

"I just want to say thank you across the board to every leader, peer, and subordinate. I appreciate you. I could not have done it without you," said Cohen.










# Retirement

DEOMI hosted an Equal Opportunity Advisor Reserve Component Course graduation ceremony on Feb. 17, 2023, for more than 70 individuals from across the Department of Defense. The purpose of the 4-week EOARCC is to train and certify Armed Forces personnel, assigned to military and civilian Equal Opportunity positions, as equal opportunity advisors or command climate specialists. Deputy Commanding General of the U.S. Army Reserve Command, U.S. Army Maj. Gen. Eugene "Gene" LeBoeuf, served as guest speaker for the graduation ceremony.



#### **EPS-E (23-27 JAN)**

The Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Professional Series Entry is a 5-day course that introduces students to EEO counseling and helps develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes essential to the EEO occupation that allow graduates to serve as effective EEO Counselors or Practitioners at the entry-level.



#### **DPMC (6-10 FEB)**

The Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Disability Program Management Course helps develop the knowledge and skills needed to manage Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Employment Programs with a focus on individuals with disabilities and targeted disabilities. The 5-day course describes the specific roles and responsibilities of a full-time or collateral-duty Disability Program Manager. It also provides an understanding of the regulatory guidance concerning the laws and directives that support disability program practices and procedures.



#### **EEO-MC (13-17 FEB)**

The Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Mediation Course provides DoD personnel with the fundamental training required to act as mediators, or third-party neutrals, with mediation and other alternative dispute resolution (ADR) skills. The course also addresses ADR methods and common application as practiced within the DoD with a focus on facilitative mediation and provides participants with the basic skills necessary to resolve EO, EEO, and other workplace disputes.

### **COURSE REVIEW**



#### FTDC (27 FEB - 10 MAR)

The Faculty Training and Development Course is an 80-hour academic course that uses a multidimensional method of instruction to deliver a performance-based, trainee-centered, curriculum. The course provides faculty members with the principles and theories that are the underpinnings of group instruction and facilitation at DEOMI.



### EEO-CC (6 MAR - 20 MAR)

The Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Counselors Course is a 5-day course that introduces students to EEO with in the Federal sector, where they may serve as liaisons between employees and managers, during the informal complain processing stage.



### LTAS-V (8 MAR)

The Leadership Team Awareness Seminar-Virtual seminar is designed to enhance the awareness of contemporary EO, EEO, and human relations challenges that affect many of our services, governmental, and DoD agencies. The seminar is also designed to help senior level supervisors and command teams identify and address those challenges, through engagement and interaction with subject matter experts from around the government, DoD, and academia.

Nearly a hundred students begin Day-1 of the Equal Opportunity Advisor Course (EOAC) on Mar. 27, 2023. The 7-week EOAC trains and certifies Armed Forces personnel assigned to military and civilian Equal Opportunity billets as Equal Opportunity Advisors or Command Climate Specialists. Upon graduating, students are fully prepared to serve as advisors to Commanders on Military Equal Opportunity matters.
