Since July, 2004, we have managed to maintain a secure and safe haven for at-risk kids," said Marks, "and we believe our kids can gain much in character development from community involvement in the program."

"The children were able to see and learn from example that it doesn't matter where you come from, what you look like, and no matter your age, you can succeed in accomplishing your dreams," she said.

"What The Master's Workshop and Sgt. Kengne-Ouafo are doing with these children is nothing short of extraordinary. We have been blessed by the presence of these children and we can only hope that we have been a blessing to them," said Smith.

Kengne-Ouafo was born and raised in Cameroon and has served in the Army for six years after earning a double major at Penn State University, and graduated while still learning English, with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Management and Marketing.

"When I first joined DEOMI in October, 2016, I read their mission statement which is to "Deliver and Develop Human Relations Education, Training, Research, and Innovative Solutions to Enhance Total Force Readiness," he said.



"So I took this opportunity to represent what DEOMI is teaching here at the Institute and put that philosophy to work in the community where it's most needed.

"I was introduced to Miss Janet in March of this year. Since then I have been going there every Tuesday from 5-7 p.m., and other times when possible," he said.

"My only goal there is to work with these children, doing what I can to develop them educationally -- and maybe most importantly -- leading them toward positive dreams," he said with conviction.

"What a great trip. What a great experience for our kids," she said.
